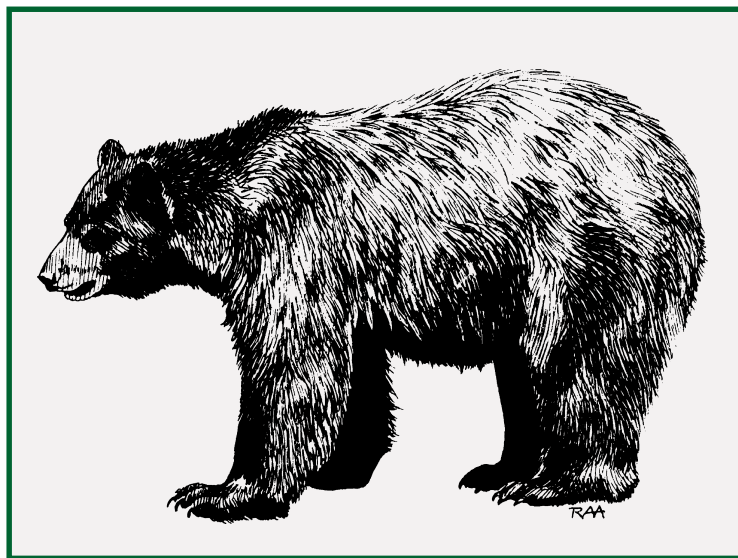


Discover Moosalamoo's Rich Ecosystem

Make the habitat connection

Watch for black bears, moose, white-tailed deer, rabbits, owls, red-tailed hawks and many songbirds. These are just a few of the species that find food and shelter in Moosalamoo's diverse ecosystem.



Black bears spend the winter in Moosalamoo, hibernating under brush piles, inside hollow trees and beneath rock overhangs.

See the forest ... for the trees

Walk through Moosalamoo's wooded areas and find many kinds of northern hardwood trees – like sugar maple, American beech and yellow birch.

In some areas of the Forest, trees have been cut. The Forest Service carefully selects areas for timber harvest to provide beneficial habitat for wildlife, create scenic vistas, improve forest health and produce wood products like furniture, building materials, paper and firewood.
